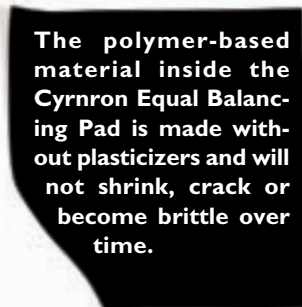

PRODUCT: The Energy Balancing Pad

WHAT IT IS: A high-tech saddle pad designed scientifically to provide the best fit for horses. Sections constructed of medical-grade, heat-sensitive material are layered as needed for fitting any saddle.

WHO WOULD BUY THIS PRODUCT: Riders interested in purchasing a saddle pad that will work on any horse in any riding situation.
COMMENTS FROM OUR TESTERS: Editor Paul Wahl has been using the pad on his horse, Jack, since September.

"When I got Jack this past summer, he hadn't been ridden much in several years, and he was terribly unbalanced to the right," said Wahl. "He wouldn't canter on his left lead, and as a result of the sparse use of that side, his body had built up considerably more on the right. I tried a variety of saddle and pad combinations, but no matter what I used, the saddle would pinch on one side and slop around on the other side."

Wahl was given the Western version of the Cynron Energy Balancing Pad along with a Cynron Western saddle for the test.

"The saddle is great, but the pad is nothing short of amazing," Wahl said. "I noticed a difference in Jack from the first ride. It didn't take long for him to become more balanced and a better performer."

The material in the pad is designed to absorb impact and dissipate it with each movement of the horse and rider. The pad material bio-conforms, taking on the shape of whatever is against it. For the ultimate test, Wahl used the Energy Balancing Pad under a saddle that he knew was too small for his horse.

"The pad equalized the pressure on Jack's back so well that there were no dry spots, no bridging, no wear marks, nothing," Wahl said. "I wouldn't recommend that you ride continually with the pad and a too-small saddle, but for testing purposes, it was quite revealing."

Since the Western version of the pad is slightly smaller than the Cynron Western saddle, Wahl opted to use it with a standard Western saddle pad.

"The layering meant you had to cinch up more tightly than I prefer to keep the 'sandwich' in place, but the material in the pad is malleable enough so that it nests nicely with another pad," Wahl said. ☐
