A bucket is a bucket is a bucket—they're round(ish), hold water or feed, and generally come with a host of slightly annoying characteristics. These new, innovative bucket solutions tackle everything from sloshing to slime:

So Long to Slime

Infused with ionic silver, Equifit's CleanBucket (the newest addition to the company's Ag Silver line) helps minimize bucket slime by controlling bacterial growth. Unlike regular plastic or rubber buckets, the CleanBucket only needs scrubbing once a month (or even every other month). And, according to Equifit, in side-to-side testing, horses preferred the CleanBucket water over standard bucket water four to zero.

Slosh Stopper

The Water-n-Hole by Horse Spa Products is the ultimate solution for slosh-free drinking and spill-proof eating. This nylon bucket rim with a soft, stretchy neoprene-lined bumper traps water while allowing the horse easy access all the way to the bottom of the bucket. Ideal for providing water on the road (not just at rest stops) or feeding at a show or on the trail. Fits five-gallon, flat-backed buckets.

Under Cover

Perfect for packing or storing feed, hauling water, and keeping food safe from flies, spills, dust and rain, the Horse Spa Bucket Covers are the "Why didn't I think of that?" solution to common bucket woes. Made of solid, 840-denier, waterproof nylon in a wide variety of styles and sizes (including clear and mesh top), the patent-pending cover design allows for free movement of bucket handles while



securely covering and protecting the contents inside.

Natural Grazer

The Mowl from Equine Originals gives horses the opportunity to feed in a natural grazing position—without the worries about spilled (and wasted) feed, or ingestion of sand or dirt. The key to the Mowl's innovative design? A 3-gallon rubber feed pan firmly attached to a 44 x 40 x 5/8-inch rubber mat. The result is a tip-proof, grain-saving feeder that will also help condition your horse's jaw, neck, back and legs by stretching and strengthening the muscles as he eats.

Stiff Upper Lip

Horsemen's Pride has come up with an attachment for its feeders called the Slow Feeder Lip. Because it makes it hard for a horse to get his whole muzzle in the bucket, it serves a couple of purposes. First, it prevents the animal from throwing his food around, saving on feed and also avoiding messes. Second, it helps encourage slower feeding, since the horse is not able to take whole mouthfuls at a time. Eating slower can aid digestion and help prevent conditions such as colic and choking.
